### Retail Sales Index and Food & Beverage Services Index February 2026

Retail Trade and Food & Beverage (F&B) services are integral to Singapore's domestic consumption, catering to consumers' daily needs and enjoyment. Retailers sell merchandise directly to consumers while F&B operators provide prepared food and drinks for consumption on-premises or take-away. The Retail Sales Index (RSI) and Food & Beverage Services Index (FSI) measure the performance of the Retail Trade and F&B services industries in Singapore respectively, based on the monthly sales of businesses (which include online sales) in these industries. The key indicators also include a snapshot of the proportion of sales conducted online.

## OVERVIEW – RETAIL TRADE

On a year-on-year basis, retail sales increased 8.3% in February 2026, reversing the 0.5% decrease in January 2026. The growth in retail sales was partly due to Chinese New Year occurring in February this year as opposed to January last year. For the two-month period (January to February), retail sales grew by 3.5% in 2026 compared to 2025. Excluding Motor Vehicles, Parts & Accessories, retail sales increased 11.2% in February 2026, compared to the 2.9% decline in January 2026. On a seasonally adjusted basis, retail sales declined 4.1% in February 2026 over the previous month. Excluding Motor Vehicles, Parts & Accessories, seasonally adjusted retail sales fell 4.2% compared to January 2026.

The estimated total retail sales value in February 2026 was \$4.2 billion. Of this, an estimated 14.1% were from online retail sales, compared to the 13.9% recorded in January 2026. Excluding Motor Vehicles, Parts & Accessories, the total retail sales value was about \$3.6 billion, of which 16.2% were from online retail sales. Online retail sales made up 56.3%, 39.9% and 11.2% of the total sales of the Computer & Telecommunications Equipment, Furniture & Household Equipment and Supermarkets & Hypermarkets industries respectively.

### Year-on-Year Change (at Current Prices)

Within the Retail Trade sector, majority of the industries recorded year-on-year growth in sales in February 2026. The Supermarkets & Hypermarkets, Recreational Goods, and Department Stores industries recorded year-on-year growths in sales of 29.3%, 26.0%, and 16.8% respectively.














In contrast, the Petrol Service Stations and Motor Vehicles, Parts & Accessories industries recorded year-on-year declines in sales of 9.8% and 7.8% respectively in February 2026.

### Month-on-Month Change (at Current Prices, Seasonally Adjusted)

On a seasonally adjusted month-on-month basis, most industries recorded decline in sales in February 2026. Sales of Wearing Apparel & Footwear fell 14.4%. Similarly, retailers of Watches & Jewellery and Mini-marts & Convenience Stores saw declines in sales of 13.9% and 13.8% respectively.

Conversely, sales of the Recreational Goods and Computer & Telecommunications Equipment industries increased 6.7% and 5.5% respectively in February 2026.

## OVERVIEW – FOOD & BEVERAGE SERVICES

Sales of Food & Beverage (F&B) services rose 5.5% in February 2026 on a year-on-year basis, compared to the 3.2% decline in January 2026. The higher F&B sales were similarly due to the difference in the Chinese New Year period. For the two-month period (January to February), F&B sales increased 1.0% in 2026 compared to 2025. On a seasonally adjusted basis, sales of F&B services rose 0.9% in February 2026 compared to the previous month.

The total sales value of F&B services in February 2026 was estimated at \$1.6 billion. Of this, an estimated 20.3% were from online sales, lower than the 22.5% recorded in January 2026.

### Year-on-Year Change

(at Current Prices)

Within the F&B services sector, sales of Food Caterers and Restaurants increased 12.6% and 9.2% respectively. Similarly, sales of Fast Food Outlets and Cafes rose 4.9% and 0.4% during this period.

In contrast, turnover of Food Courts & Other Eating Places fell 4.4% in February 2026.

### Month-on-Month Change

(at Current Prices, Seasonally Adjusted)

On a seasonally adjusted month-on-month basis, sales of Restaurants and Food Caterers increased 5.7% and 2.9% respectively.

Conversely, turnover of Fast Food Outlets, Cafes as well as Food Courts & Other Eating Places registered declines in sales of 7.5%, 4.3% and 3.8% respectively in February 2026.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

### Introduction

The Retail Sales Index (RSI) and Food & Beverage Services Index (FSI) measure the monthly sales performance of the Retail Trade and Food & Beverage (F&B) services industries based on the sales records of Retail Trade and F&B services establishments<sup>1</sup> respectively. Sales figure refers to the value of retail goods or food & beverages sold to consumers during the month, excluding taxes on products such as Goods and Services Tax (GST), Additional Registration Fee (ARF) and Certificates of Entitlement (COE).

The RSI and FSI are available at current prices and in volume terms. The indices at current prices measure the changes of sales values which can result from changes in both price and quantity, while the indices in volume terms measure the changes in the volume of economic activity by removing the price effect.

To reflect changes in the structure of retail trade and F&B services industries, the coverage and weighting patterns of the RSI and FSI series are revised at periodic intervals. These two indices have been re-based from reference year 2017 to 2025, the 8th re-basing exercise of the series. The new RSI and FSI series (2025=100) have been released with effect from the January 2026 report.

### Data Collection

Data used to compile the RSI and FSI are obtained primarily from the monthly surveys of retail trade and F&B services establishments. Retail trade establishments sell merchandise directly to the consumers, while F&B services establishments sell prepared food and drinks for consumption on premises or on a take-away basis.

The Monthly Retail Sales Survey (RSS) and Food & Beverage Services Survey (FSS) surveyed approximately 460 retail trade and 270 F&B services enterprises respectively. Firms that responded in each reference month accounted for about 80% of the sales revenue among all firms selected for the RSS and FSS.

### Index Compilation

To derive the RSI and FSI at detailed industry level, the monthly sales for that industry is divided by the average monthly sales for the same industry in the reference year.

The overall RSI and FSI are then computed by combining the sales indices of the detailed industries, using weights which measure each industry's relative importance in the overall Retail Trade and F&B services industries respectively.

To derive the indices in chained volume terms, the sales indices at current prices at detailed industry level are first deflated by the appropriate price indices. These component indices are then weighted using previous years' weights to derive the overall indices in chained volume terms. The reference year of the indices is 2025.

### Online Retail and Food & Beverage Sales Proportions

The Retail Trade statistics cover:

- (a) (multi-channel) retailers in Singapore that sell via both physical stores and online/e-commerce sites;
- (b) retailers in Singapore that sell via physical stores only; and
- (c) retailers in Singapore that sell mainly via online/e-commerce sites.

The F&B services statistics cover all sales transactions of F&B establishments regardless of mode (including those transacted via food delivery platforms).

The proportion of online retail and F&B sales<sup>2</sup> out of the respective industry's total retail and F&B sales is estimated for the overall Retail Trade sector, selected retail industries and the overall F&B services sector.

### Seasonal Adjustment

Seasonal effects are observed in both the RSI and FSI as there are usually intra-year periodic variations that repeat during the fixed period of time every year. To better reflect the underlying trend of the monthly sales, both indices are seasonally adjusted to remove the seasonal effects.

<sup>1</sup> Individual stalls in hawker centres, food courts, coffee shops or canteens are not covered.

<sup>2</sup> Online retail and F&B sales refer to the sales of goods where the order is received remotely and the price and terms of sale are agreed upon via online means, e.g. through company's website, third-party websites (e.g., online marketplaces, food delivery platforms), or mobile applications, regardless of how or where the goods are delivered or collected. This excludes orders made via telephone calls, facsimile, in-premise orders via kiosks or QR codes, and manually typed emails or messages. Payment may or may not be made online.
